Power of Education Campaign is working on their initiative to work on the Student Portal, with SAC approving of the 7.2 million dollar campaign, this is one of their current projects to improve the College, the portal being one of them. Centralized Student Cart Experience for all College Purchases, Access to Georgian Academic Software from Student labs or personal computers, One Card solution with full integration into the portal, and many more functions to be added, through analysis of GC students (surveys, focus groups with CCR, providing feedback). A suggestion is to survey the students where they are already waiting in lines, already (ex. September rush at the bookstore, Lunch rushes) with incentives. The portal will be released in phases for efficiency for updates and to adjust the portal as necessary.
