Description

This program offers the student an introduction to college studies, with emphasis on critical thinking and analytical skills developed while studying courses in the Social Sciences and Humanities. Many students use the General Arts and Science program as a transition to further studies at either the college or university level. Students can also choose to continue from the one-year certificate to the two-year diploma in General Arts and Science.

Career Opportunities

While most students choose General Arts and Science as a pathway to further studies, some graduates of the program find employment in occupations requiring a general education or with firms that prefer to administer their own training program.

Program Learning Outcomes

The graduate has reliably demonstrated the ability to:

1. develop, through general knowledge gained in a wide range of subjects, insight into both self and society;
2. develop flexibility and clarity of both thought and expression in order to develop communications competence to a level required by business and industry;
3. utilize critical thinking processes and problem solving techniques;
4. examine and evaluate various aspects of our changing society to assist in developing a sense of personal and social responsibility as a citizen in society;
5. assess the effect of personal decisions and actions on the environment;
6. employ entrepreneurial strategies to identify and respond to new opportunities.
