Through her many years of dedicated service to and with Georgian College, Ruthanne Krant built the Human Resource Management programs from scratch. Her legacy to the college is the development, achievement and successful implementation of professional Human Resource Management programs that are recognized around the world. Quite simply, we would not be where we are today without her. Ruthanne had many 'roles' during her tenure with the college. She retired in the spring of 2013 while holding the position of Coordinator for the Human Resource Management programs in the School of Business. In this role, she continued to develop the human resources
