Internal, non-curricular-related events include applicant receptions, orientation for international students, town hall and update meetings, networking and career fairs, student association events, awards dinner, announcements from government officials and employee professional development events (list not inclusive), several of which featured guest speakers. Approximately 247 internal non-curriculum related events were held at Georgian College between August 1, 2019 and July 31, 2020.

Georgian also permits space on campus to be rented for a variety of events by external groups, including associations, corporations, educational institutions, government, not-for-profit and sports/recreation organizations. Since August 1, 2019, approximately 61 external organizations have conducted their events on the campus.
