Do I need to apply?

Part-time students must apply to this program through <u>ontariocolleges.ca</u> Use the code KBDX.

When can I start the program?

September and January intakes

Can I take this program online? Yes!

This program is delivered through GC Flex.

What is GC Flex?

A GC Flex course means faculty deliver lectures and labs in the classroom and simultaneously online.

This means the course has a day and a time so that students can come in person, they can watch the lecture live virtually during the class time OR they can take the course asynchronously.

All students are in the same section. You just study the way that works best for you.

Students wanting to study online asynchronously – PLEASE NOTE – because these courses are delivered in 3 different methods, the course you register into will show a day and time on our website – if you choose to study asynchronously, you are not required to attend live classes, either virtually or on-campus. Courses are identified as GC Flex.





How do I know which courses to take?

We have set a schedule up for you – review the DELIVERY SCHEDULE posted on the <u>Kitchen and</u> Bath Design program page:



The Delivery Schedule shows the order in which part-time students should take courses. This was set by the program coordinator and is highly recommended you follow the path to ensure you have courses to take each semester. If you have questions about which courses to take, connect with the program coordinator listed on the Delivery Schedule.

How long will it take to complete the certificate?

By following the sequencing in the Delivery Schedule:

3 courses per semester: finish in 4 semesters (2 years)

Example: Fall – Winter – Fall – Winter

Winter intake

Winter - Summer - Fall - Winter

What is the cost of the program?

There is no program fee when studying part-time. As a part-time student, you can take 1, 2 or 3 courses at a time in any given semester.

Payment is per course, as you register.

The course fees change year-to-year and course to course. The best source for accurate fees is to check the website: <u>Kitchen and Bath Design</u>



Can I transfer credits/use prior learning to fast track?

The Credit Transfer Centre (CTC) assists with:

- Transferring courses completed at another accredited institution which may be eligible for transfer towards your education at Georgian.
- Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) students can challenge course requirements based on relevant work or life skills and knowledge gained.
