Why am I taking General Education courses?

General Education (GenEd) courses provide learning opportunities that are relevant to our rapidly changing world. You will find these courses are directly related to your life, not only as a college student or worker, but also as a family member, citizen and lifelong learner. In addition, it is through GenEd courses that you will develop research, writing and critical thinking skills that will help you succeed in your chosen program of study.

How many General Education courses do I need to take?

Use Banner, MyPath and your program outline to determine exactly how many GenEds you are required to take. Whenever possible, take your GenEds in the semester designated in your program map to avoid additional fees being charged and/or delayed completion of your program. Most programs require three to six GenEd credits, which are mandated by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities.

If I took General Education courses at another college or university, do I still need to take them at Georgian?

If you attended an accredited college or university, we strongly suggest you have your education and credits evaluated through Georgian's Credit Transfer Centre as you might be entitled to transfer credits. Do the General Education courses available differ for each program?

Generally, no. Since GenEd courses are meant to broaden your knowledge base, we try to give you the option to choose whatever suits your specific learning interests. There are some programs that do not allow you to take certain GenEd courses because they have core program courses very similar to our GenEd; however, in most cases, any student will have access to any GenEd being offered provided there is space, and it fits into your timetable.

If I decide to go to another college or university will my General Education courses be transferable?

You will receive a copy of the course outline and syllabus within the first two weeks of class. It is your responsibility to save these documents to use for possible future transfer requests with other colleges/universities. A minimum grade of 60 per cent or higher is generally needed for any institution to consider a course for transferability, and the additional information of the course outline and syllabus may also be required for your new institution to make an informed decision.
