Early Childhood Education Program

FIELD PLACEMENT information – Fall 2023 intake

General Information

The two field placements required for this program must be completed in-person. Students are responsible for contacting the placement office to indicate their intent to go on placement. How long it takes for a placement to be approved by the field placement office depends on a variety of factors. Students are encouraged to begin plans for field placement as soon as possible, and at least one semester in advance of when they intend to complete a field placement. Depending on the agency, placement approvals may take several months. For this program, students must be under the supervision of a person with sufficient credentials, such as a Registered Early Childhood Educator in a regulated Early Learning Environment.

Note: Most agencies may require students to provide documentation/certification such as a vulnerable sector screening check, First Aid, CPR, and Immunization Records.

Criminal Reference/Vulnerable Sector Check

Placement agencies require an up-to-date clear criminal reference check and vulnerable sector check prior to going out on placement. Students should obtain their criminal reference three months prior to placement; checks conducted earlier may not be considered current. As some jurisdictions require longer lead-time for processing, please check with the program coordinator to ensure you allow for

sufficient turn-around time. It is the student's responsibility to provide the completed document prior to placement start.

NOTE: A record of criminal offences, for which a pardon has not been granted, may prevent students from completing their placements, thereby affecting their ability to graduate.

Additional pre-requisite information

Applicants may be asked to provide community agencies with proof of completion of Standard First Aid and CPR Level C certification as well as an up-to-date immunization record with a two-step TB test in some circumstances to proceed with field placement. Students are required to review agency requirements provided by the field placement office. Proof of completion of the <u>Ontario Ministry of Labour Health and Safety Awareness training must also be provided before proceeding on field placement.</u>

It is strongly recommended that students accepted into the ECE program have volunteer or past work experience in a licensed childcare setting. This experience orients and prepares the student for their academic work in the ECE program.

Procedure

Students need to contact the Field Placement Office a minimum of one semester prior to the semester they plan to complete a placement and before they reach out to any agencies.

The Field Placement Office will send you the information you need to research and secure a placement along with all supporting documents.

All placement requirements are due the following dates:

- March 30 for a summer semester placement
- July 30 for a fall semester placement
- November 30 for a winter semester placement

When you have located an agency, contact the Field Placement office. Use your Georgian student email account.

Include the following information:

- Your first and last name, student number, and name of program
- Where you would like to complete your placement and if you have transportation to commute to placement
- Identify whether you are preparing for ECED 1036 Field Placement 1 or ECED 2030 Field Placement 2
- Note what semester you are hoping to complete placement

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition

Some students may be eligible for prior learning assessment and recognition (PLAR) for certain courses and/or placements.

For placement, this would require a request to PLAR from either ECED 1036 Field Placement 1 or ECED 2030 Field Placement 2.

In order for a PLAR to be considered for placement, a person who is satisfactorily qualified (typically an RECE), must be supervising the work to be considered for the PLAR.

For each application, students need to submit a resume, proof of employment in the position, job description, and a summary of how the required learning outcomes have been met (confirmed by a supervisor).
