Do I have to do a Co-op Work Term as a part-time student?

Yes, Co-op Work Terms are part of the graduation requirements for all students.

If you are working full-time and are unable to complete a co-op, please connect with us to discuss your options.

Are courses delivered in the evening? Online?

Part-time students enrolled in the Environmental Technician Diploma take courses along with the full-time students. There are no courses specifically scheduled in the evening. Courses are delivered on campus. The course schedules (day/time) usually becomes available 6 weeks prior to the semester start date.

Communications and General Education courses are available online.

What is the cost of the program?

There is no program fee when studying part-time.

As a part-time student, you can take 1, 2 or 3 courses at a time in any given semester.

Payment is per course, as you register.

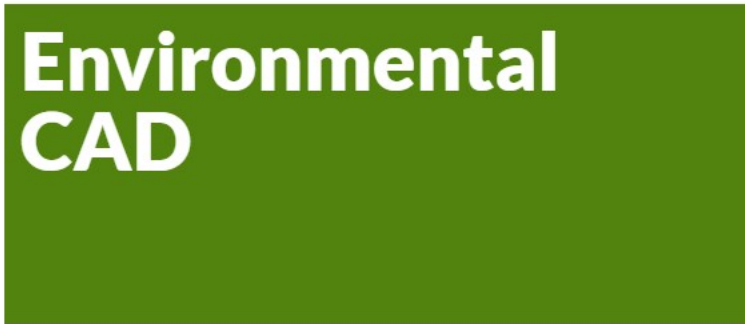
PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Environmental Technician students are trained as entry-level practitioners in the use of environmental sampling, monitoring and testing equipment and information technology tools and will be familiar with standard operating procedures for conducting environmental projects. Students are provided with applied knowledge of health, safety and environmental legislative requirements, environmental management systems, and the basic principles of ecosystem-based management for sustainability.

Emphasis is placed on contours, plan and profile, cross-section and determining earthwork quantities, topographical survey and structures as they relate to environmental engineering. Specific CAD techniques and procedures are applied to the creation of these drawings.
