Do I need to apply?

Part-time students must apply to this program through <u>ontariocolleges.ca</u> Use the PSWX.

Intakes: September 2024 Barrie campus

Program delivery

The part time program will be delivered in-person on campus in Barrie.

When do clinical placements start? Where are they located?

Clinical placements (Professional Practice courses) are in your last semester of study. The placement facilities are located in Simcoe County but are not necessarily in Barrie. Students are responsible for transportation and parking arrangements and costs.

What is a part-time student?

As a part-time student, you can take 1, 2 or 3 courses (sometimes 4 depending on course hours) at a time in any given semester.

How do I know which courses to take?

We have set a schedule up for you - review the Program Map posted on the Personal Support Worker program page.

What is the cost of the program?

There is no program fee when studying part-time. Payment is per course, as you register. The course fees change year-to-year and course to course. The best source for accurate fees is to check the website for Personal Support Worker.

How long will it take to complete the certificate?

This varies depending on how you choose to complete your Clinical Placements. Following the program map provided students will finish the program in August 2025.

How can I ensure I am ready for my Clinical Placements?

You will need a Clinical Preparedness Permit.

Once you are accepted into the program, you will receive a package; in it there will be a web link where you can find and print the permit. The permit lists the requirements you must complete before you are eligible to attend your first clinical placement, including:

- Standard First Aid with Level HCP CPR or BLS (Basic Life Saving) with Red Cross
- Up to date immunizations
- Clear Police check, including a Vulnerable Sector Screen (VSS)
- Record of mask fit test (included in student fees and will be done at the college in semester one)
- Ministry of Labour Worker Health and Safety Awareness
- WHMIS training you must complete the training specified for the program (80% is a pass) even if you have completed it elsewhere.

We strongly encourage you to complete all requirements (excluding mask fit test, WHMIS and Ministry of Labour Worker Health and Safety Awareness) before you start your first classes in semester one, as you may need to consult your doctor or local Public Health Unit. This can be difficult once you are attending school in Barrie. Also, depending on where you live, the VSS can take up to 12 weeks to be processed.
