Important info for students arriving in Canada for **THE FALL 2020 SEMESTER**

International students and co-arriving immediate family members **MUST self-quarantine upon arrival in Canada for 14 days**

- The current government regulations only allow international students to enter Canada who obtained their visa on or before March 18, 2020 and have courses that are **delivered on-site**. CBSA/immigration border officers will be the final agency to make the decision.
- If you are a student in a program with in-class components, **you MUST purchase a Georgian quarantine package** from Georgian (more info below)
- You **MUST** present your self-quarantine plan to border officials upon arrival (more info below)
- you are responsible for covering the cost of everything needed during quarantine (including accommodations, food and hygiene products).
- **You cannot leave your self-quarantine location** until the 14 days are over (this includes not going to classes or going to get food).
- The Government of Canada is mandating one COVID-19 test to be administered to every student during their time of quarantine. Watch this [webpage](#) for more details.



Entry to Canada

International students with valid study permits – or who were approved for study permits on or before March 18, 2020, and have an in-class component this fall, are allowed to enter Canada. Please note that it is up to the discretion of the border agent to approve entry into Canada.

While travelling, you will need to pass two health checks: first, by the airline before you board your flight, and then again when you enter Canada. If you show symptoms of COVID-19, you will not be able to board your flight.

14-day self-quarantine

International students and co-arriving immediate family members **MUST** self-quarantine for 14-days upon arrival to Canada.

What is self-quarantine?

Self-quarantine is used to keep someone who might have been exposed to COVID-19 away from others. Quarantine helps prevent spread of disease that can occur before a person knows they are sick or if they are infected with the virus without feeling symptoms. People in quarantine must stay home, separate themselves from others and monitor their health.

What happens if I don't self-quarantine?

The Government of Canada has issued an emergency order under the Quarantine Act which applies to everyone. Failure to comply with this order is an offence will result in applicable charges, which **may include \$750,000 in fines and/or six months in prison**. [Read more information on applicable charges](#). This is each student's responsibility.

The Government of Canada is mandating one COVID-19 test to be administered to every student during their time of quarantine. Watch our [website](#) for more details.

How do I quarantine?

- **Stay** at your place of quarantine;
- **Do not leave** your place of quarantine unless it is to seek medical attention;
- **Do not use** public transportation (e.g. bus, taxi, subway, Uber, Lyft, etc.);
- **Do not have** visitors;
- **Do not go** to school, work or any other public areas;
- **Arrange for all necessities to be delivered** to your place of quarantine (e.g. food, medication, cleaning supplies, etc.);
- **Follow the instructions** provided to by Public Health Canada: [How to quarantine](#);
- **Continually** self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms.

Self-quarantine plan

A quarantine plan is mandatory for all for international students and co-arriving immediate family members arriving in Canada.

You must complete your 14-day quarantine before starting your in-person courses, so please schedule your arrival into Canada accordingly. The earliest your in-person courses could begin is Sept. 14.

Print out a page with your self-quarantine plan and keep a copy on your mobile device at all times. Your self-quarantine plan must include:

- the address and contact info of your self-quarantine accommodations
- how you are getting from the airport to your accommodation without using public transportation
- how you will have access to food and water without leaving your place (like grocery or meal delivery)

Self-quarantine packages

If you are coming to Georgian this fall **you MUST purchase a Georgian quarantine package.** These packages will help you with everything you need to quarantine properly. They include:

- accommodations for 15 days/14 nights
- private transportation from airport to accommodations
- Guard.me health insurance
- Georgian quarantine letter
- Canadian SIM card for mobile phone
- universal power adapter
- welcome bag from Georgian (includes sanitizer, toilet paper, mask, gloves, notebook pen and more)

Georgian's quarantine checklist

- Complete** your mandatory international [commitment form](#). **Students who do not comply could risk delay or a hold placed on their continued registration in their program.**
- Ensure you can provide a **working phone number** where you can be reached in Canada to the Canada Immigration Officer upon arrival. It is recommended to purchase an international calling card for Canada prior to departure.
- Be prepared to present your quarantine plan (Georgian's mandatory quarantine package) upon arrival to Canada.
- Read** Public Health Ontario's [how to self-isolate instructions](#).
- Download the 'Georgian Assist' app for your mobile device to learn more about Georgian College, our local communities, and the programs and services offered.

Confirm your study permit

To register for courses, you must let us know as soon as you have an approved study permit.

Email reginternational@georgiancollege.ca as soon as you receive it.

Remember to include your name, program, student number, and a copy of your study permit approval in your email. If you are experiencing delays with your study permit, it is very important to email us and let us know.

Work permit for work-related studies

If you are in a program with a work component (co-op, field placement, field training, industry placement, practicum, clinical placement, practical experience or internship, paid or unpaid), you are required to have a co-op work permit before starting the work term. You should apply for this with your study permit.

You will have received a co-op supporting letter along with your acceptance letter that you can use to apply for the co-op work permit along with the study permit.

The conditions allowing you to work off-campus attached to a study permit are NOT interchangeable with the requirement to fulfill a work placement related to your studies. You need a separate co-op work permit for completing your work term.

Register for your courses

Once you have confirmed you have an approved study permit, you will be able to pick your courses.

You must register between August 18 to 20, 2020 to ensure a complete timetable. Last day to register is September 18, 2020. [GeorgianCollege.ca/admissions/banner-login-information](https://www.georgiancollege.ca/admissions/banner-login-information)

The Office of the Registrar will be providing system support sessions for Fall 2020. 1 Homestay

Homestay provides a safe, caring and interactive family environment for international students to improve language skills and cultural awareness. Homestay families provide necessary household items such as linens and towels. Bedrooms are furnished with a bed/bedding, desk or table, lamp, dresser and closet.

To participate in the Homestay program, students are expected to stay for two months or more in their Homestay. Students must pay first and last month's rent to the host family on the day of their arrival (see the Homestay application form for details). You must submit your Homestay application at least two weeks before you plan on arriving.

To apply for the homestay program, contact Canada Homestay Network. There is a \$250 application fee.

Without meals



– **\$645 a month**




2 On-campus residence

On-campus residences are offered at the Barrie, Orillia and Owen Sound campuses. Enjoy the convenience of being steps away from campus and the opportunity to fully integrate into Canadian student culture, take part in residence life programs, and make lifelong friendships with fellow residents. 3 Off-campus residences

Places4Students.com allows you to search local rental property listings. In addition, there are private residences nearby. In Barrie, some options include Foundry Georgian, Georgian Green, London Property Corp., and School House Barrie; in Orillia, there is Hilda House; and in Owen Sound there is Owen Sound Student Residence. Georgian doesn't inspect off-campus housing, so use due diligence when looking for accommodation. Georgian Green Student Residence apartments are located across the street from the Barrie Campus. These four-storey residential buildings house 257 students and have been specifically designed to meet the needs of students attending Georgian College. Students will be required to sign an eight to 12-month lease and provide their own linen, food, cutlery and dishes. Approximate rental cost is \$7,000 for eight months. 4 Find your own place

If you prefer to find your own accommodations, visit our off-campus housing resources page at Georgiancollege.ca/international/student-life/housing/#off-campus-housing. Be prepared to share a house/room with other students, purchase and prepare your own meals, pay your own bills, and live with other college students. The cost of room rentals is generally between \$650 and \$800 per month (meals not included) for a private room in a shared house or apartment with other students. Make sure to budget an extra \$100 to \$150 for utilities.

How do I pay for housing and living expenses?

It is important that you bring money with you when you arrive to pay for housing and immediate living expenses such as a phone, books and food. We suggest you bring traveler's cheques, since bank drafts can have holds placed on them for one month and you cannot access the money until the hold is removed.

You pay for your tuition and housing separately. Tuition is paid to Georgian College. Housing is paid directly to the Homestay company, the residence, or your landlord.

Bring proof of **IMMUNIZATION RECORDS**

We recommend all students bring a current immunization record (not mandatory)

In case you get sick while in Canada, it is highly recommended that you bring an updated immunization record signed by a doctor and officially translated into English. Immunization records must mention the following:

- generic type of the vaccine (e.g. Diphtheria); not just a product or a brand name of the vaccine – if possible, include dosage details and manufacturing lot number of vaccine
- date when the vaccine was taken, including day, month and year
- full name of the doctor who administered the vaccine – MUST also include any license or registration number of the doctor
- complete address of the doctor's clinic and contact details (address of the clinic or hospital, landline phone number and/or cell phone number)

It is OK if you have separate vaccination records from different doctors. Bring all records of every vaccine you have taken. Records for vaccines listed below are highly recommended. Check with your doctor if you need to update any vaccine or take a booster:

- Tetanus
- Diphtheria
- Polio
- Hepatitis B
- Pertussis (whooping cough)
- Measles, Mumps and Rubella (known by its abbreviation of MMR)
- Varicella (for Chicken Pox)
- any other vaccine you may have (e.g. BCG, Yellow Fever, Smallpox, etc.)

FORMS AND PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS

Health and Wellness, Community Safety and Human Services programs

Many programs, particularly in Health and Wellness, Community Safety, and Human Services include placements that require immunization or criminal record checks among other possible requirements. These requirements must be met before your placement starts. **It is your responsibility to ensure that you are eligible to participate.** Click on the “Placement requirement forms” tab at GeorgianCollege.ca/admissions/forms to see if your program has requirements you need to meet before the term starts. If you have questions, find your program co-ordinator’s contact information at GeorgianCollege.ca/full-time-programs.

Placements require TB clearance; if you have a positive TB test (either from the 1 step or the 2 step), then a chest X-ray is also required.

The college assumes no responsibility on these matters and students should be aware that we are unable to refund tuition fees in the event that access to a placement is denied.

Time to **START PACKING**

Things to consider before you pack:

- verify your luggage restrictions with your airline
- check which items Canadian Border Services Agency (CBSA) does not permit through Customs, such as firearms, pets, plants, fresh fruits and vegetables, meat and meat products
- do not pack any money or valuable items in your checked luggage
- pack two sets of clothing in your hand luggage in case your flight is delayed or if your luggage gets lost in transit.
- don't forget to pack your laptop and phone adapters and voltage converters

In Canada the power plugs and sockets are type A and B (see below). The standard voltage is 120 V and the standard frequency is 60 Hz. If you are bringing any electronics with you, you probably need a voltage converter (or your electronics will break), so you should consider a combined power plug adapter/voltage converter.

Documents to bring

You will need to bring the following documents into Canada with you, but **DO NOT** keep them in your checked luggage as you travel.

- photo identification
- official academic transcripts and degree certificates
- English language test scores
- international driver's licence or driver's licence from your home country
- driving history (if you plan to buy a car in Canada)
- immunization records (see page 14 for details)
- visa/study permit approval letter
- passport
- Georgian College acceptance letter
- addresses and contact info for accommodations in Canada

NOTE: All documents in your native language should be translated into English.



What to bring during COVID-19?

1. Masks
2. Gloves
3. Small sanitizers
5. Travel credit card
6. Tooth brush
7. Some protein bars in checked in luggage

What kind of clothes should I bring?

Bring whatever clothing you like in the style you are used to wearing – there is no dress code at Georgian College. Students usually dress casually in comfortable and practical clothes. You may want to bring a formal outfit for interviews. The weather in Canada varies from season to season. Although classrooms are heated in the winter and air-conditioned in the summer, we recommend you bring different types of clothing to suit the changing climate.

- light-weight clothing is best for spring and summer
- sweaters and light waterproof jackets are useful for cool and rainy days in the spring and fall
- heavy jackets, scarves, gloves, hats and waterproof boots are essential for winter

What should I wear in the winter?

If you are coming to Canada from a warm climate, especially if you are arriving in the winter (December to March), be sure to bring warm clothing. You may find it less expensive to purchase additional winter clothing in Canada. Most students dress in layers as it may be cold outside, but warmer inside, including in your home, the college and stores.

Can I buy everything when I get there?


Yes! We recommend you buy bulkier or heavier items once you have arrived, especially if you have a luggage allowance. Everything you may need is available locally in each campus community.

Learn about Canadian money

The features of a winter jacket

According to how active you are in the winter time, you may need a different type of winter jacket. If you are a more active person in the winter then a ski jacket is recommended, while down jackets are great for those who only want to walk to school.*



***Not sure what you are looking for?** Ask a sales associate at the store you are in. They are there to help you.

Looking for winter boots

Your safety in winter conditions is an investment in the health and well-being of you and your loved ones – take the time and effort to invest in quality winter boots that will keep you safe and warm all winter long.

Proper boot height

So snow doesn't get inside your boots and melt, making you wet and cold. Some boots come with a fleece collar or drawstring at the top to prevent this.

Liner

Thick and soft liner inside to keep your feet warm and dry.

Upper

Waterproof material such as water-resistant treated leather, suede or synthetic faux-fur for warm uppers.

Full lacing system

For a tighter fit and to prevent socks from slipping down, keeping you toasty and warm.

Sole


Light-weighted rubber provides protection from water and chilly temperatures, and is easy to clean.

Tread

Look for crosshatching that will grip in icy conditions without clogging full of snow.

Heal

Low, wide heels with a solid tread.

Georgian ONECARD

ONEcard is the official Georgian identification card.

Features extend far beyond a simple ID – it's your student card, bus pass (for Barrie students only), library card, athletic centre card, and a convenient payment for select vendors on-campus and off-campus – all in one!

- Your student card is your ONEcard.
- Use ONEcard at participating locations to purchase food and beverages and make purchases at Georgian Stores.
- Students or supporters can add funds and track spending 24/7 from anywhere around the world.
- No transaction or monthly fees.
- If a card is lost or stolen, students can deactivate their card at any time to protect their balance.
- ONEcard offers the opportunity to help students plan and budget spending and keeps track of all their spending from textbooks and coffee, to lunches and snacks.
- Avoid carrying bulky cash and coins, and leave your credit cards at home – just swipe and go!
- Add additional money to your account as you go – online or at most major banks.
- Submit your own ONEcard photo before you pick it up onephoto.georgiancollege.ca.
- Your universal bus pass (UPass) sticker will be issued to eligible students when you receive your ONEcard. This allows you unlimited use of the Barrie City Transit while you are a full-time student (Barrie Campus students only).

Your ONEcard has a flex dollar account which operates on a declining balance system. Every time a purchase is made, the amount is subtracted from your balance, which you can easily track.

After submitting your photo online, you can pick up your ONEcard (once you arrive on campus) from the Registrar's Office (first floor of C building) with your student number, a piece of government photo identification (e.g. driver's licence, passport) and your acceptance letter. To pick up your card you must be registered in the current or upcoming school term.



Additional INFORMATION

Drinking water

Ontario has set up an award-winning drinking water safety net to ensure water quality.

Protecting water at its source is a crucial first step in Ontario's approach to delivering safe drinking water. When you turn on your tap, you can be confident that your drinking water is among the best protected in the world. This means you can feel free to drink water from the tap in your home or anywhere else in Canada.

Mobile phones

You can bring your mobile phone to Canada and purchase a sim card here. There are several different mobile phone providers all over town (and even at the airport) where you can get a sim card and, if you need it, a cell phone. Some of the more well known companies include Rogers, Bell, Telus, Fido and Virgin Mobile.

If you are planning to bring your current mobile phone with you, you will want to make sure it will work with the Canadian mobile phone networks. To check if it will work here follow these steps:

1. Visit <https://willmyphonework.net>
2. Select your phone brand and model
3. Under country select 'Canada'
4. Under carriers you can check any of the big carriers (Rogers, Bell, Telus, Fido and Virgin Mobile)
5. Click 'Search'

Underneath it will show you which networks your phone may work with.

Canada is well known for having free Wi-Fi in many stores and businesses including all Georgian College campuses. Wherever there is free Wi-Fi you can use the data features on your smartphone for free without using data (as long as you are connected to the Wi-Fi). There are many restaurants, coffee shops and other stores that also offer free Wi-Fi. Some landlords also include Wi-Fi in the rental fees.
